PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

Our program prepares students for Ph.D. programs in a variety of areas of psychology. It is a good match for students who wish to strengthen their profiles in preparation for application to Ph.D. programs or explore research and graduate level work before making a commitment to additional training.

OUR TRAINING MODEL

Our program is research oriented and uses a faculty mentorship model. There are many opportunities to gain valuable laboratory experience in conducting research, including experimental studies with human subjects. Students work directly with an M.A. <u>faculty mentor</u> to complete a thesis project and assist with other research projects. Review each faculty's focus of research and typical projects by visiting their websites and past research publications. Mention how your research interests match their lab activities when writing your statement of purpose.

We do not offer training in technical, clinical, or counseling skills. Alternative options for these skills include <u>clinical psychology</u>, <u>counseling</u>, or <u>social work</u>.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

This program takes 2-3 years to complete. It requires <u>30 units of coursework</u> and an independent research thesis. This is a full-time program requiring high research commitment.
